Recognized as one of the top 10 ski areas in North America, the Telluride Ski Resort offers excellent terrain in a spectacular setting.





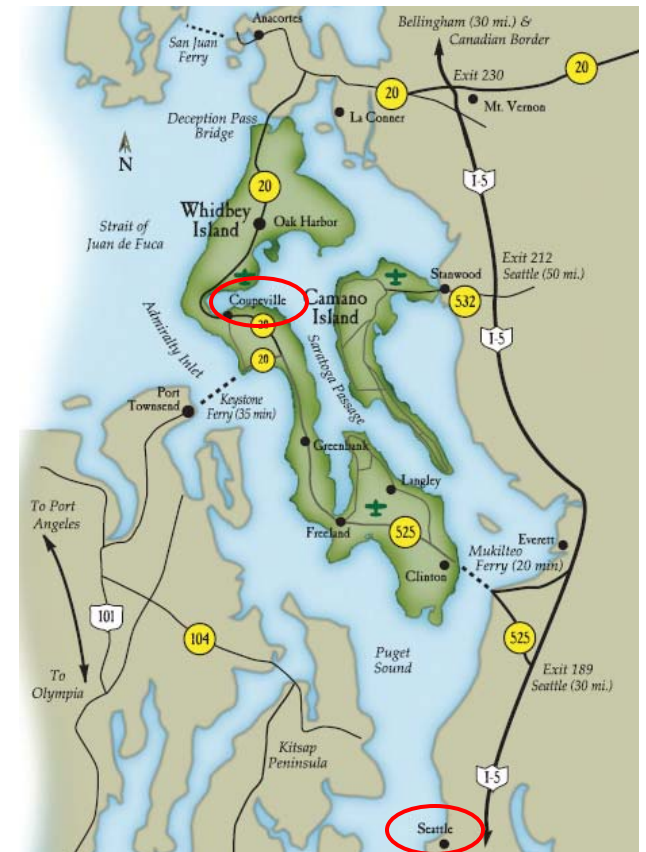
BEACHFRONT VACATION HOME WHIDBEY ISLAND, WASHINGTON
