Texas Advocacy Project’s mission is to end dating and domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking in Texas. Texas Advocacy Project empowers survivors through free legal services and access to the justice system, and advances prevention through public outreach and education. Our vision is that all Texans live free from abuse.

WHO WE HELP



Provided free legal services to 4,765 primary survivors in power-based abuse cases



Supported clients from ages 13 to 84 years old



Served 10,502 clients and children across the state



Served survivors in 58% of all counties in Texas

WHY WE HELP

Nearly 1 in 3 human trafficking victims are recruited by a family member or caregiver*

74%* of all Texans will experience domestic violence or will know someone who has

1 in 10* children have seen one parent assault another

Over half of U.S. women and almost 1 in 3 U.S. men will experience sexual violence*

U.S. economy loses \$8.3 billion annually due to domestic violence*

HOW WE HELP

14 staff attorneys and 3 social workers provided civil legal and social services

Provided 3,932 victims with financial empowerment tools for financial abuse matters

Provided 1,254 clients and their family members with social work services

Educated 4,906 judges, prosecutors, law enforcement officers, educators, students, military members, health care providers, and other advocates

Distributed 2,072 handbags, diaper bags, and unisex tote bags to domestic violence shelters, clinics, hospitals, and more, as well as 1,951 backpacks to children across Texas agencies.

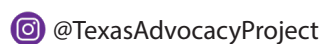


Provided training on healthy relationships, teen dating violence, online safety, and leadership skills to 348 teenagers – 88 of which served as Teen Ambassadors of Hope.
